We are excited for this opportunity and looking forward to this potentially incredible partnership.

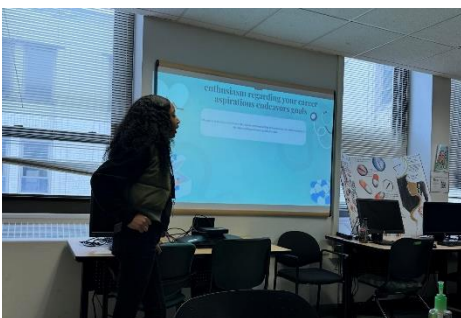


Work Based Learning Readiness

CTT CORNER

A Medical Assistant and phlebotomy technician is a healthcare professional trained to draw blood from patients for medical testing, transfusions, donations, or research. They work in hospitals, labs, and clinics, specializing in venipuncture, fingerstick, and heel sticks on infants, while ensuring patient comfort, safety, and proper specimen labeling.

Key Responsibilities

Blood Collection: Performing venipuncture (vein) and dermal punctures (skin) efficiently.

Patient Care: Verifying patient identity, explaining procedures, and calming anxious patients.

Sample Management: Properly labeling, handling, and transporting specimens to the laboratory.

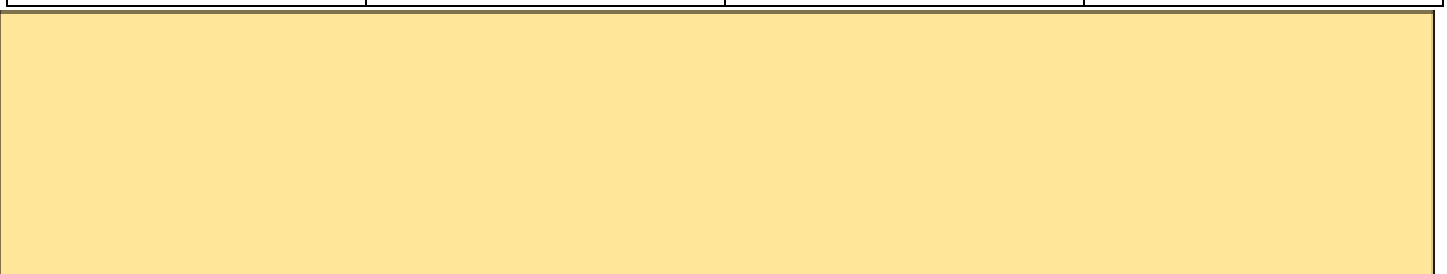
Safety & Sanitation: Maintaining sterile equipment, following infection control protocols, and disposing of needles safely.

Our Medical Assistant students at the Philadelphia Job Corps have started their journey in learning a new clinical skill of Phlebotomy. They have learned proper technique of drawing blood; finger sticks and capillary draws. OSHA protocols are very important to follow as this could lead to a serious injury. The students are excited to accomplish this clinical skill to add to marking off items on the TAR.
