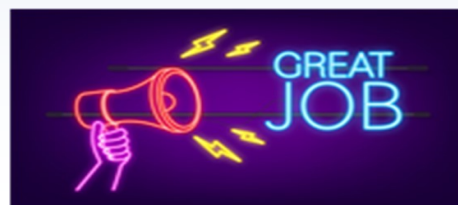

Meet Jose Garcia!



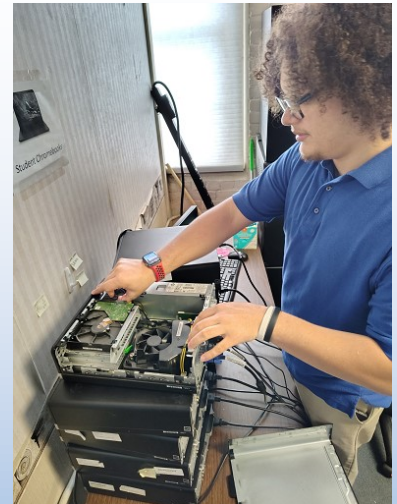

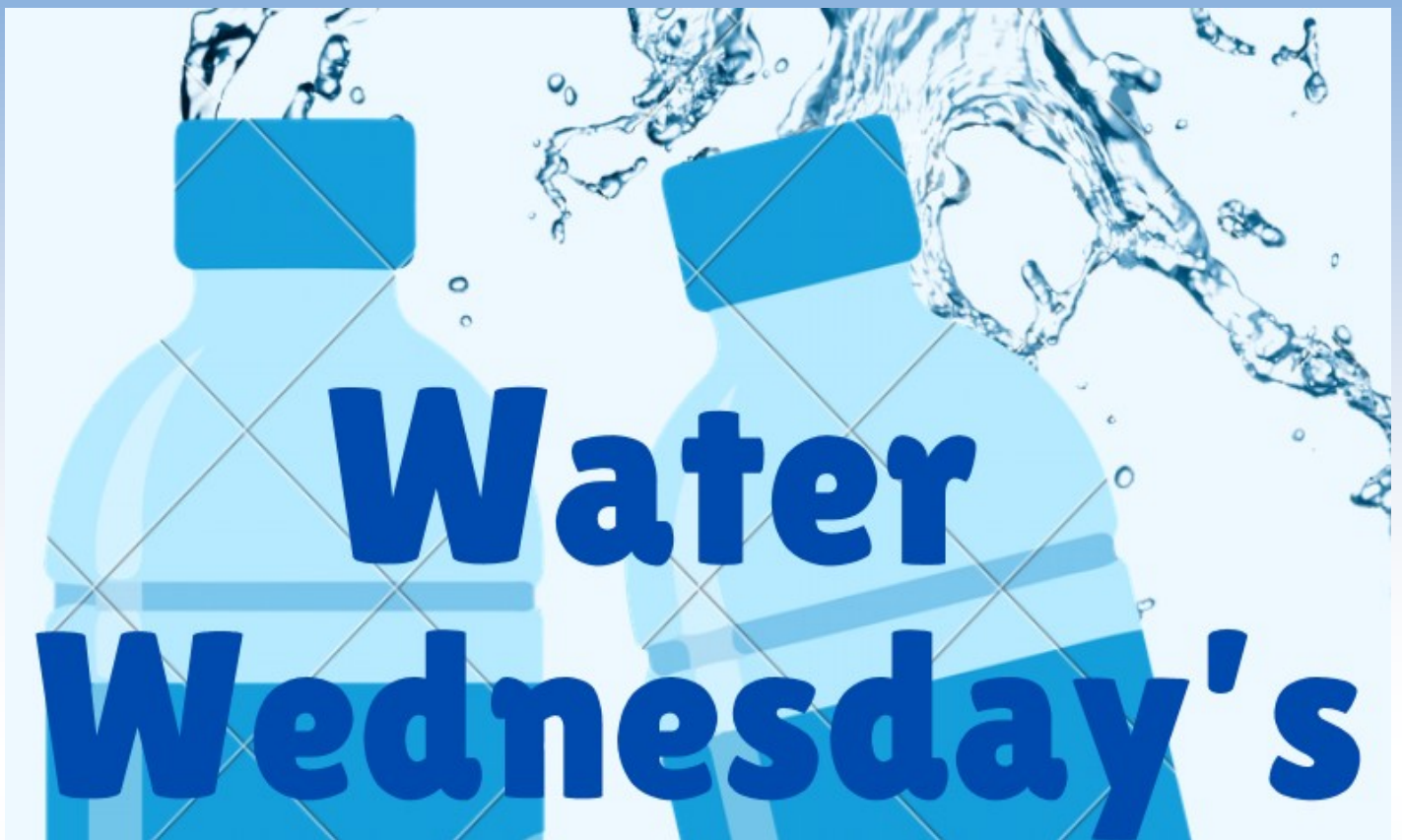
