Greetings Brunswick Job Corps!

We celebrated National Apprenticeship Week in a big way at Brunswick Job Corps Center.

On Wednesday, we had a representative, Gerald Dockery, from Primoris Renewable Energy, a very large contractor with projects around the country. Our students were very engaged as they listened to the presentation and Mr. Dockery fielded many questions. We have several students who are excited and are applying as they plan their transition from the Job Corps program. We appreciate Mr. Dockery presenting and touring our trade shops.

On Thursday, we had a panel of experts who discussed their apprenticeship opportunities. We had Zack Jackson from the Carpenters Local 256, David Dye, from the Southern District Training Trust Fund, Glenn Davies from the International Union of Painter and Allied Trades, and Halie Parker, Coastal Pines Technical College Apprenticeship Coordinator. The panelists answered a series of questions from the moderator and then took several questions from the student body. They not only presented their unique apprenticeship programs but were very open about the advantages of entering an apprenticeship program versus entering the job market directly.

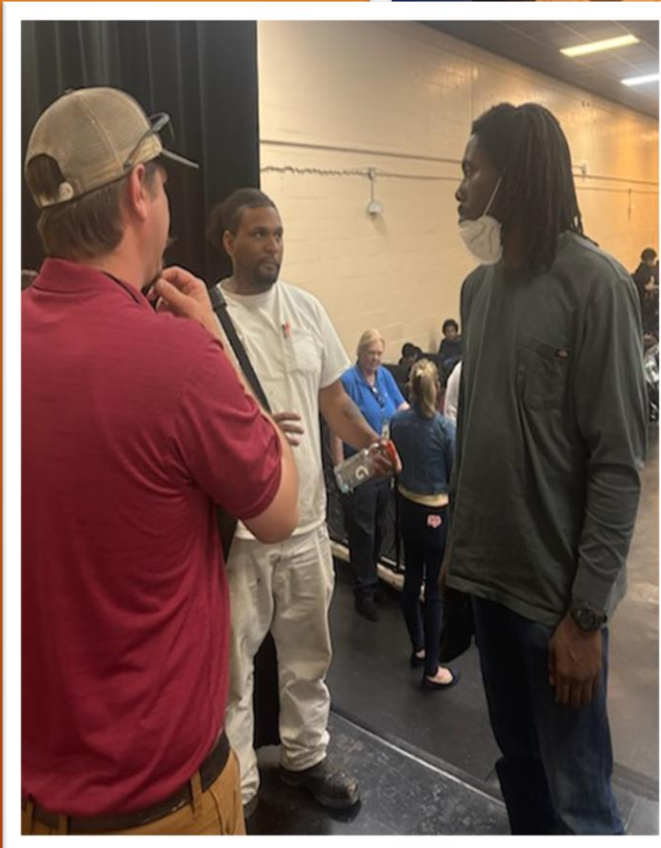

From April 23–26, Brunswick Admissions Manager Janita Beckles represented Adams & Associates and the Brunswick Job Corps Center at the DOL Job Corps x BuildSubmarines.com Fan Zone activation during the Talladega Superspeedway NASCAR event. This high-energy event drew thousands of attendees, providing an excellent platform to engage with a large and diverse audience. Through direct outreach and conversations, the team successfully connected with hundreds of individuals who expressed strong interest in Job Corps opportunities. Ms. Beckles had the opportunity to meet and engage with Erin McGee the National Director of Job Corps, Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary Lori Frazier Bearden, Victoria Young Division of Regional Operations and Program Integrity (DROPI) and Thomas Hughlett with Maritime Industrial Base Program.

During the activation, Ms. Beckles highlighted Brunswick's in-demand training programs, including Electrician, Painting, Business Construction Technology, and HVAC. In addition, opportunities available through contractual centers Turner Job Corps Center and Earle C. Clements Job Corps Center were promoted, particularly their welding programs. Three exceptional students from the Shreveport Job Corps Center were chosen to demonstrate their welding skills to the attendees in the Welding Mobile Trailer in addition to the CTT manager Mr. Ellis, Welding Instructor Mr. Rashad, Center Director Mr. Kelly, and President/CEO Benjie Williams of Human Learning Systems. Also in attendance was Gadsden Job Corps center staff Ms. Perry, Ms. Cooper, and Ms. Rosie.

Aligned with this year's theme, "**GIANT Careers Begin Here,**" the engagement focused on inspiring attendees to envision long-term career pathways through skilled trades and workforce development programs. The event proved to be a valuable opportunity to increase awareness, generate interest, and build meaningful connections with prospective students about the Job Corps program.

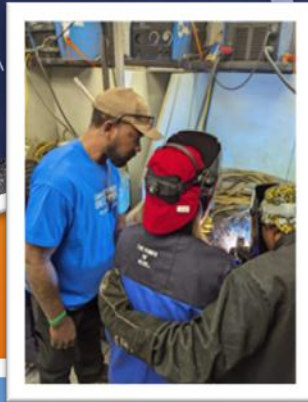
Leads Generated: 218 confirmed active leads via our interactive system. They are still awaiting website traffic reporting and will share those numbers as soon as they are available.

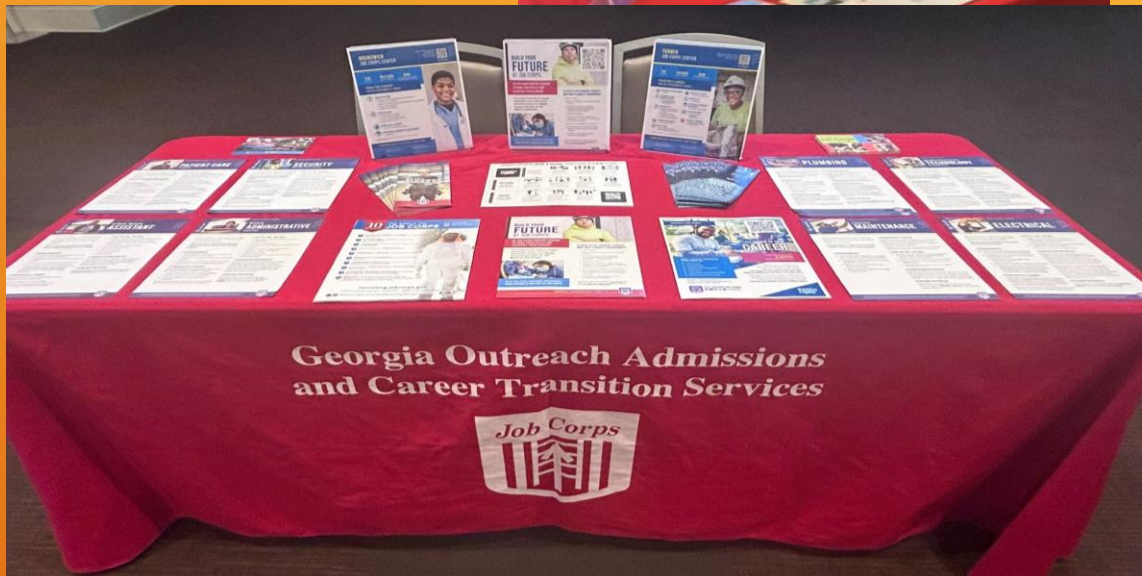
Informational Fliers Distributed: Approximately 2,000
