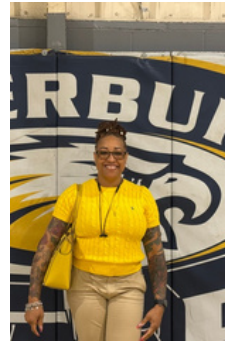

Destination WBL

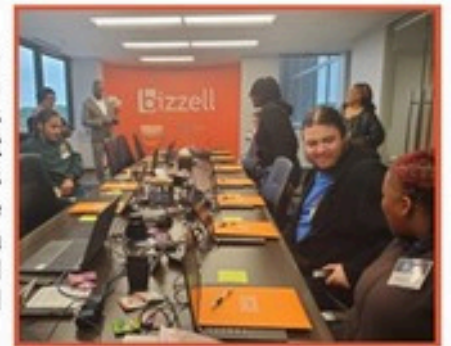
