The summit provided training and increased understanding of how mental health impacts individuals and included suicide prevention education. During the event, AR Butler learned about additional organizations that serve the same age group as Job Corps participants, including Lowndes Associated Ministries to People, Inc. and Coastal Plain Valdosta.

AR Butler also established a partnership with the Echols County School District and, through engagement with youth attendees, identified five potential prospects.

Destination WBL

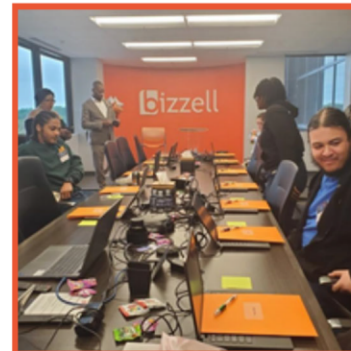
