Over the past week, twelve TCU/IAM Advanced Training students have been participating in work-based learning with Keolis. Students ride Commuter Rail trains and conduct Customer Satisfaction Surveys with passengers on board the trains. These usually take place twice a year: Spring and Fall. This has been one of the most successful projects to date! The goal was to obtain 1,200 completed surveys. As of May 20th, 1,358 surveys have been completed by the team. A2 Staffing from France conducts the project and supervises the students, Carole Gailliau, the leader of the project stated; "It's a great campaign with great teams, made up of motivated students who are a pleasure to work with."

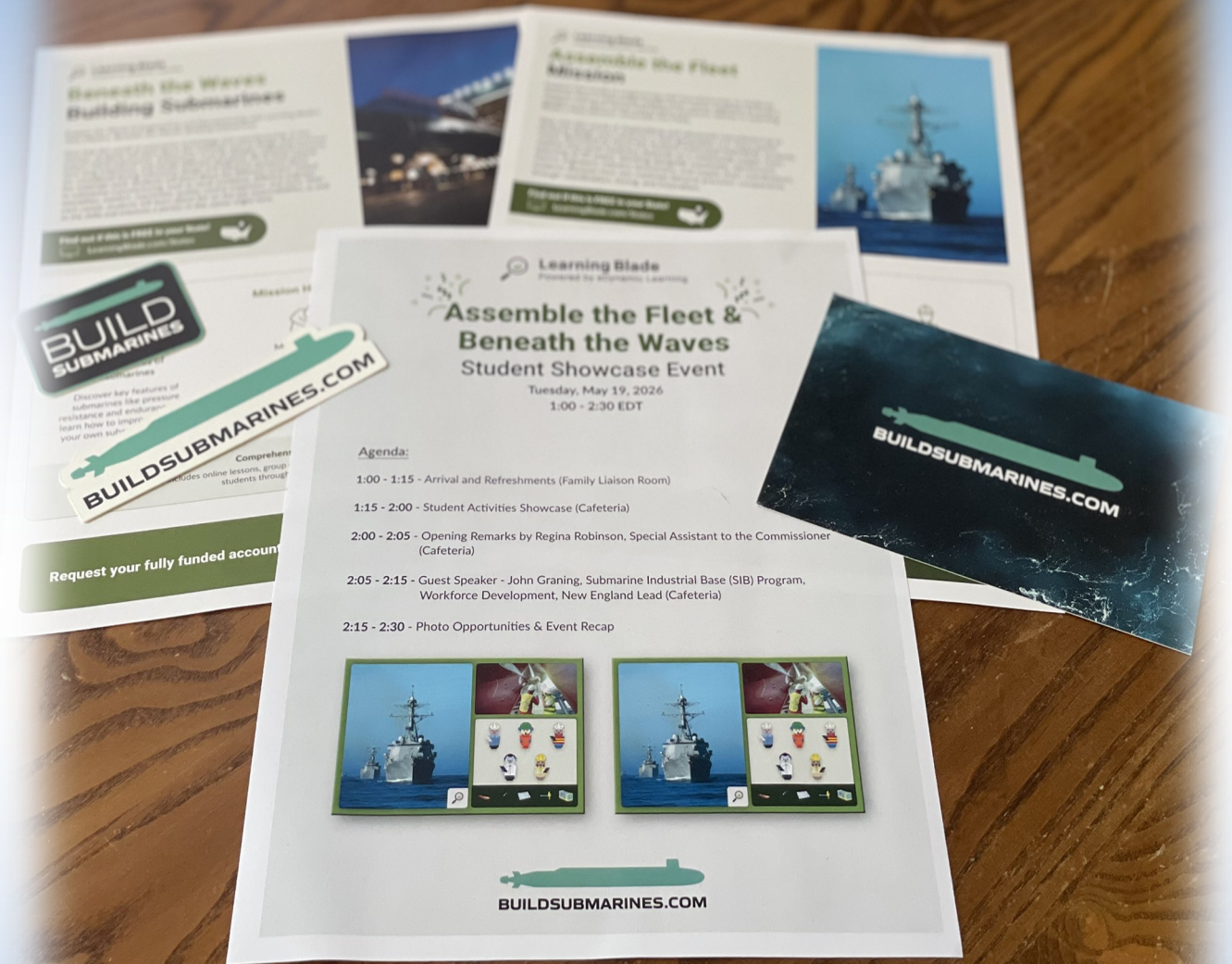

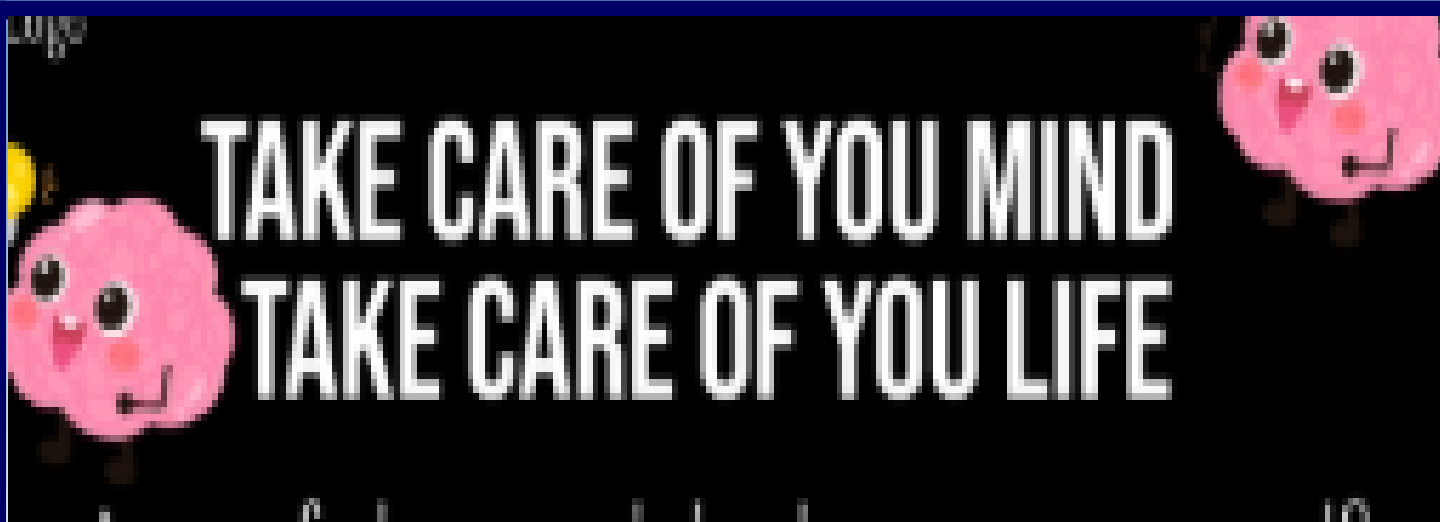

Mental Wellness for Students and Young Adults

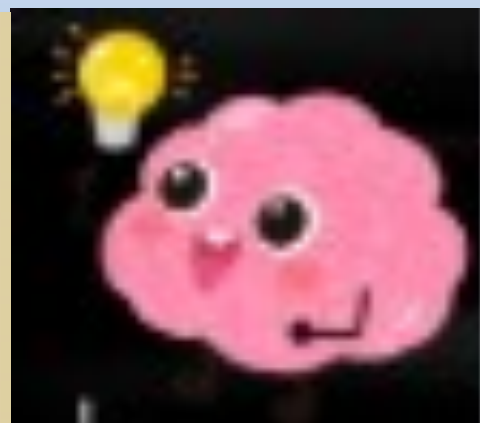

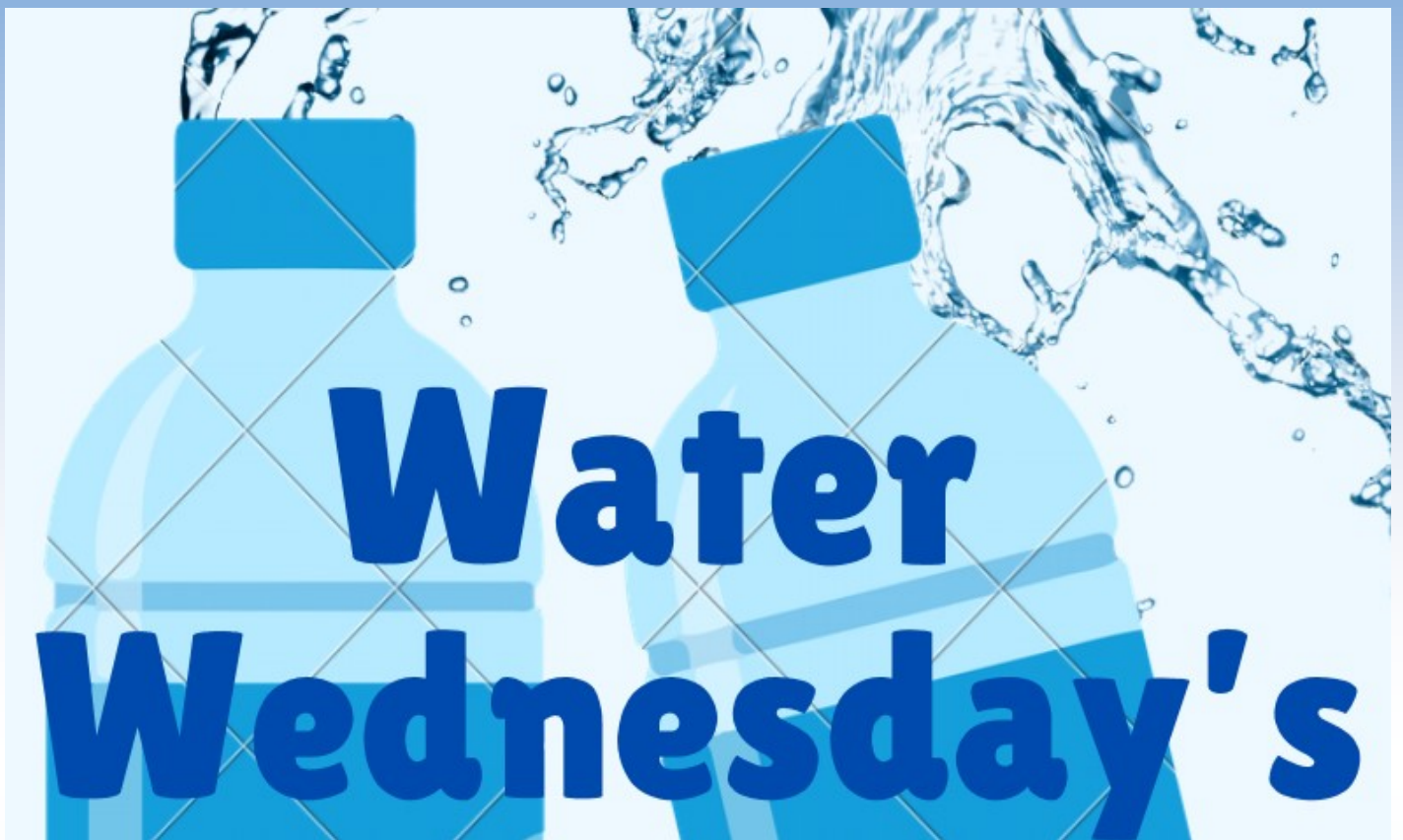

MART Connects Service Update

Ayer, Devens, Lancaster, Shirley



MART Connects is transitioning to an updated service model with a more structured approach to ensure service remains available throughout the service area for as long as possible under current funding.

Effective April 28, 2026



How it works:

- Trips are available up to 20 miles within the service area.
- Curb-to-curb service within the service area.
- Connections are available at Monument Square (Leominster).
- Trips are scheduled in advance.
- Vehicles may serve multiple riders along the way to improve availability.



How to book a ride:

Call: **(978) 345-7711** Advance reservations are required by 2:00 PM the day prior to travel.



Service hours: **Monday - Friday | 5:30 AM - 10:00 PM**

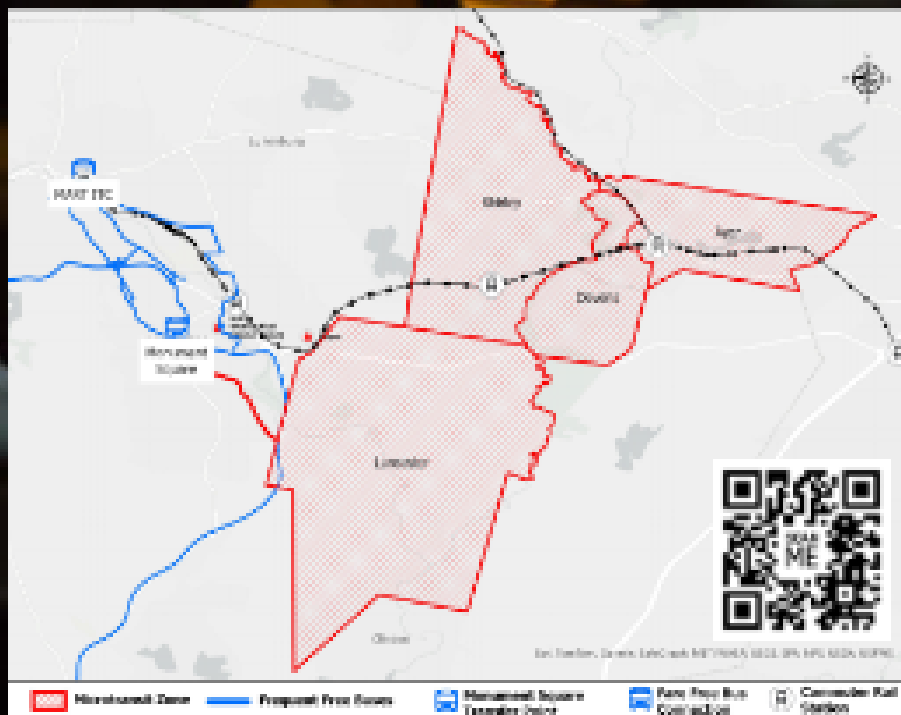


Connections beyond the service area:

Service connects through Monument Square (Leominster), providing access to:

- MART fixed-route bus service
- Regional destinations
- Commuter rail access via Ayer and Shirley

Free transfers are available to MART fixed routes at Monument Square.



Credit/Debit cards and tickets for purchase are accepted. Individuals 12 and younger must be accompanied by an adult.
