Spotlight on Women's History Month: Amelia Earhart

March is Women's History Month and the beginning of my influential women series. I want to start off the series with an amazing woman who has been in the news lately:

Amelia Earhart (who I happen to be related to).

Amelia's claim to fame was being the first woman to fly across the Atlantic Ocean. Though she did not pilot the plane, this was still a big deal. Amelia did set a record by flying at an altitude of 18,415 feet in 1928. In 1932, She crossed the Atlantic Ocean on her own! In 1935, she made the 2,408-mile journey from Hawaii to California solo and later that year, she flew for LA to Mexico City. Amelia set out to fly around the world in 1937. She began her journey on June 1 in Miami. She made it to New Guinea 28 days later. On July 2 Amelia headed to Howland Island, but never




made it. It is believed that her plane went down about 100 miles from the island never to be seen again. Amelia made news again in February when explorers from Deep Sea Vision let it be known that they produced a sonar image that could be Amelia's Lockheed 10-E Electra. This story is still unfolding!

Piloting is not the only thing Amelia is famous for. She also encouraged women to forget social norms and pursue what they wanted. She helped found an organization of female



pilots called the Ninety-Nines where she was its first president. Lastly, she designed a clothing line "for the woman who lives actively".

Amelia was a pioneer in a field that was controlled by men. She pursued her dreams and did not let anyone tell her she couldn't do it. Thanks Amelia for your contributions to women!
