Highlighting Partnerships

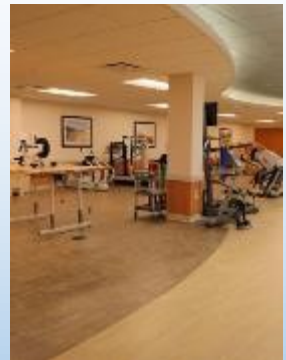

Shaker Place boasts over 200 private rooms, most resembling studio apartments with attached courtyards and expansive windows, fostering a sense of independence for residents. Moreover, Shaker Place not only sits on a bus route but also provides free bus passes to staff, ensuring transportation never hinders attendance. They're also in the final stages of developing a comprehensive childcare program, easing the burden for working families. These perks are just a glimpse of what they offer.

Frank continues to offer internships to students, with 10 openings covering various trades such as Medical Administrative Assistant, Certified Nursing Assistant, Facilities Maintenance, Security, and Culinary. Following the outstanding tour, Frank agreed to allow classes to visit for field trips.

Hello, world!

Let's talk about setting up computers with the proper wires!



If you saw last week's tip, we're going to be using everything from that along with some new wires.



Let's gather everything we need to properly hook up a computer!






To set up a computer we will need:

- Computer
- Monitor
- 2 Power Cables
- 1 Visual Cable
- Mouse
- Keyboard


Now you may be thinking, "What in the world is a visual cable?"



Visual cables are used to transport image data from your PC to your Monitor. These are usually HDMI or DisplayPort Cables, but can be a variety of other older cables like VGA.

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The monitor is easy, so let's start there! You're going to plug in two things..

Your computer will also need power to an outlet, so plug that in as well.

Last, but not least, you need a way to interact with the computer!
