I had the opportunity to sit down with the brothers and speak to them about their time at Job Corps.

Mrs. Payne: How have the things you have learned during your time at Job Corps helped you to be successful in your time at Krieger?

Kareem: "I really liked the structure of the program because that structure allowed me to ultimately have success now at my job. It taught me not only the academics and training but the life skills I needed to be successful."

Mrs. Payne: What is your advice for other students?

Haneef: "If you are here to have fun, enjoy your time there, but if you want change, be prepared to leave as a new person, and that person can and will find success."

Mrs. Payne: How has your training given you the confidence in your new jobs?

Kareem: "The repetition and instruction provided by our instructors have allowed each of us to have the confidence we need to transfer those skills to a working job site."

"I remember the first time in electrical learning how to wire electricity to a light and seeing it turn on, what an accomplishment!" "Now those little accomplishments are equaling money in my pocket and things I never dreamed of being able to do on my own with my brother"!











Mrs. Payne: Is there anyone you would like to thank or speak about that others should know?

Kareem: "I would like to thank all of the staff that helped me come out of my shell and grow as a man and person, I participated in so many amazing things from being a part of the DEIA program to going to Washington DC with Ms. King. I would not change a minute of my time at Key Rock. I hope that all the students take advantage of the program and stay out of the stuff they should not be doing, because this success can be yours too."



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As we know we just finished tax time and at Job Corps this was no different! Mr. Burger met with students after school throughout the entire months of March & April to assist student with their tax returns.









Have you ever wondered how changes happen on center? Or how your Student Government Association communicates with the managers of every department? Well on the first Wednesday of every month, the SGA comes together with managers from every department at our monthly subcommittee meeting. At these meetings, your student government has the opportunity to discuss each department in great detail. If there is something in the dorm that needs to be fixed and a work order hasn't been submitted yet, they can talk with the maintenance manager. If there aren't enough recreation activities throughout the week, talk to the Recreation supervisor. Each SGA member is assigned a specific area to meet with during the subcommittee meeting, and that representative will meet with the manager of that respective department throughout the rest of the month before the next subcommittee meeting. They do this to ensure progress is being made on any concerns brought up from the last meeting. While meeting with the managers of these departments they may also be involved in some decisions regarding that area, they will also help plan different activities from those areas as well. If there is a trip you'd like to see recreation do, meet with the SGA on the night of the town hall meeting and bring it to their attention so the member that meets with the recreation supervisor can communicate the want for that said trip. These subcommittee meetings are important, not just for better food and trips. But to bring awareness to issues across the campus so that they can be addressed if they're not already, and to help make a difference on each center. So be sure to talk to your SGA and let them know of anything going on so that these instances can be addressed.
